HELPFUL START

Eight teams advanced to the Final Four after opening their seasons in the event. Four - Maryland (2001), Syracuse (2002), Florida (2005), and Connecticut (2013) - went on to win the National Championship that spring. Texas (2002), Marquette (2002), George Mason (2005), and Memphis (2007) are the others to reach the Final Four during the season they played in the event.

CATAPULTING INTO THE RANKINGS

The Classic has catapulted several teams into the national rankings based on their performance in the event, none so much as Arizona (2001) and Syracuse (2009). The Wildcats entered the 2001 event unranked, but wins over No. 2 Maryland (71-67) and No. 6 Florida (75-71) sent Arizona to No. 8 in the Associated Press poll immediately after the tournament. Syracuse experienced the same rush in 2009. The Orange, unranked in the AP poll and 25th in the ESPN/USA Today poll, won four games in the event, including a semifinal win over No. 12 California (95-73) and a win in the title game against No. 4 North Carolina (87-71). The next week, the Orange were ranked ninth by ESPN/USA Today and 10th by the AP.

No. 1 vs. No. 2

When No. 1 Gonzaga met No. 2 UCLA in the Empire Classic on Nov. 23, 2021, it marked only the 25th time the top two teams squared off in the regular season (the No. 2-ranked team is 13-12 in 25 regular season games).

SELECT COMPANY

A BRIEF HISTORY

2022 - St. John's took down Syracuse in a 76-69 overtime thriller in the Vivid Seats Empire Classic championship game. Syracuse won their 17th game in the event's history with a semifinal victory over Richmond. The Orange hold the record for wins in the Empire Classic. St. John's point guard Andre Curbelo won MVP of the event averaging 18 points and 5 assists in the two games.

2021 - For the 43rd time in history and 25th during the regular season, the No. 1 and No. 2 teams met when top-ranked Gonzaga faced second-ranked UCLA at T-Mobile Arena in Las Vegas. This did not hinder the Zags as Gonzaga dominated from start to finish in earning an 83-63 win. Andrew Nembhard scored a game-high 24 points to earn MVP honors. Drew Timme had 18 points and eight rebounds and Chet Holmgren added 15 points for Gonzaga.

2020 - Jeremiah Robinson-Earl scored a career-high 28 points to lead No. 3 Villanova to the 2K Empire Classic benefiting Wounded Warrior Project title with an 83-74 victory over No. 18 Arizona State. In the semifinals, the sophomore had 18 points and 10 rebounds in earning the tournament MVP award. Boston College, which fell to Villanova the night prior, edged out Rhode Island, 69-64, in the consolation game.

2019 - Vernon Carey averaged 25.5 ppg and 11.0 rpg to lead top-ranked Duke to the title of the 2K Empire Classic benefiting Wounded Warrior Project. In the championship game win over Georgetown, Carey posted 20 points and 10 rebounds as the Blue Devils scored an 81-73 win. In the semifinals, he tallied 31 points and 12 caroms in an 87-52 win over Cal. Texas rebounded from an 82-66 semifinal loss to the Hoyas with a 62-45 win over Cal in the consolation match.

2018 - Iowa led for virtually the entire game and by as many as 25 in earning the 2K Empire Classic benefiting Wounded Warrior Project title with a 91-72 win over Connecticut. Luka Garza scored 22 points and pulled down seven rebounds in claiming the tournament MVP award. The Hawkeyes advanced to the title game after upsetting No. 13 Oregon, 77-69. Oregon rebounded to beat No. 15 Syracuse, 80-65, in the consolation game.

2017 - After a seven-point win in the semifinals, Providence shot 62 percent from the field to earn a 90-63 win over Saint Louis to claim the 2K Classic title. The Friars were 31-of-50 from the field, including 9-of-10 from three, and shot 19-of-24 from the line against the Billikens. Virginia Tech, which fell to Saint Louis in the semis, took down Washington, 103-79, in the consolation game. The Hokies set a tournament record by scoring 364 points (91.0 ppg) in their four games.

2016 - Michigan won its four games by an average of over 17 points a game to take the 2K Classic title. Zak Irvin followed his 16-point, seven-rebound effort from the 79-61 semifinal win over Marquette with 16 points and six rebounds in the 76-54 championship game win over SMU to earn Most Valuable Player laurels. Pitt, which dropped a 76-67 decision to SMU in the semis, downed Marquette, 78-75, to take the consolation game.

2015 - Grayson Allen set a tournament record by scoring 62 points in the Championship Rounds (and 116 points in four games) to lead No. 5 Duke to the title. Allen, who was named MVP, had 30 points in a 79-71 semifinal win over VCU and followed that with 32 points in an 86-84 win over Georgetown in the title match. Wisconsin rebounded from a 71-61 loss to Georgetown in the semis to win the consolation game, a 74-73 triumph over VCU.

2014 - No. 10 Texas made it look easy in earning the 2K Classic benefiting Wounded Warrior Project title. In the semifinal game, Jonathan Holmes scored 19 points as the Longhorns downed Iowa, 71-57. Then in the final, Holmes amassed 21 points, 13 rebounds, and two blocked shots as Texas beat California, 71-55. For his efforts, Holmes was named the tournament's MVP. Cal advanced to the final with a 73-59 upset of No. 23 Syracuse.

2013 - No. 18 Connecticut won its two Championship Round games by a combined three points in earning its first Classic Championship in three tries. The Huskies downed Boston College, 72-70, in the semifinals before earning a 59-58 win over Indiana in the title match. It was the smallest margin of victory in the Championship Rounds in the history of the event. Shabazz Napier scored 20 points against Boston College and a game-high 27 points against Indiana to take MVP honors. UConn would go on to win the National Championship as well.

2012 - Alabama's Trevor Releford earned MVP honors, highlighted by his 25-point effort (8-10 FG, 5-5 3FG) in the Championship Game, as the Crimson Tide rolled to the tournament title. 'Bama downed Villanova, 77-55, in the title match after Rodney Cooper hit the game-winning shot in Alabama's 65-62 semifinal win over Oregon State the night before. The crown marked the second year in a row that an SEC school emerged victorious.

2011 - Mississippi State downed No. 18 Texas A&M and No. 16 Arizona to win the championship. New York native Arnett Moultrie was named the Classic's MVP.

2010 - Pitt, ranked fourth nationally, squeaked by No. 22 Texas, 68-66, to win its first-ever title. Ashton Gibbs is named the tournament's Most Valuable Player.

2009 - For the first time in the history of the event, four nationally-ranked teams participated in the Championship Rounds at Madison Square Garden. In the ESPN/USA Today preseason coaches' poll, North Carolina was ranked fourth, California was 12th, Ohio State was 17th, and Syracuse was 25th. When it was all over, Wes Johnson became a NBA lottery pick in leading Syracuse to its second Classic title.

2008 - No. 5 Duke barely broke a sweat with Championship Round wins over Southern Illinois (83-58) and Michigan (71-56).

2007 - The biggest upset in Classic history occurred in Lexington as Gardner-Webb downed No. 22 Kentucky, 84-68. No. 3 Memphis would go on to win the title with wins over Oklahoma and Connecticut.

2006 - Although his team did not win the title, Texas freshman Kevin Durant proved why he was the nation's top player by scoring 91 points and hauling down 38 rebounds in the first four games of his collegiate career.

2005 - Eventual national champion Florida tipped off its national title run with wins over No. 18 Wake Forest and No. 16 Syracuse at The Garden.

2004 - A new expanded format featuring 16 teams and four regional sites debuted. Saint Mary's upset California to crash a Top 25 party at MSG, but it was No. 6 Syracuse which came away with the title after beating No. 24 Memphis, 77-62.

2003 - As in 2002, the event featured two doubleheaders rather than a tournament format. The 2003 Classic witnessed the emergence of Jameer Nelson, who had 20 points, eight rebounds, and 10 assists in a 73-66 win over No. 10 Gonzaga. Nelson would go on to lead Saint Joseph's to the Elite Eight of the NCAA Tournament and garner national Player of the Year honors.

2002 - The previous three events each featured three ranked teams. The 2002 tournament featured three teams that would go on to the 2003 Final Four. Eventual national champion Syracuse lost to Memphis on the first day while Marquette and Texas won their games on the event's second day. Future NBA stars Carmelo Anthony, Dwyane Wade, T.J. Ford, and Mo Williams were named to the all-tournament team.

2001 - Unranked Arizona beat No. 2 Maryland and No. 6 Florida to earn the title.

2000 - No. 7 Kansas beat hometown favorite St. John's to win the championship. St. John's advanced with a 62-61 win over No. 12 Kentucky, a game which saw the Red Storm come back from four down with 22 seconds left. Kansas, Kentucky, and UCLA would each advance to the 2001 NCAA Sweet 16.

1999 - 1998-99 national finalists UConn and Duke joined Stanford and Iowa to form the strongest field to date. However, it was the Cardinal, behind twins Jason and Jarron Collins and their combined 35 points and 22 rebounds, who won the title with a 72-58 win over Iowa. UConn beat Duke in the consolation game, sending the Blue Devils to 0-2 for the first time in more than 40 years.

1998 - The Classic moved to Madison Square Garden. Seventh-ranked Temple overcame a 16-point deficit to beat Wake Forest in the championship game.

1997 - The first "tournament" in event history is held and it was Princeton which emerged victorious. After beating No. 22 Texas, the Tigers downed NC State at the Meadowlands for the title. Princeton would eventually be ranked as high as seventh this season.

1996 - It was a good day for Philadelphia as Temple and Saint Joseph's earned wins in the doubleheader in Atlantic City. The Hawks would go on to the Sweet 16 of the NCAA Tournament. The Coaches vs. Cancer program became the beneficiary of the event.

1995 - The inaugural event, known as the Atlantic City Shootout, was a doubleheader at the Atlantic City Convention Center (now Boardwalk Hall). Penn State's Pete Lisicky scored 35 points to lead the Nittany Lions to an 88-61 win over Penn. With 17 seconds left in the day's second game, Olof Landgren hit a layup to give La Salle a 68-66 upset victory over Marquette.
